Accounting and Audit Systems of State Government, Municipal Bodies, and Panchayats in Maharashtra: A Comprehensive Analysis

1. Introduction

Maharashtra, one of India's most economically significant states, possesses a complex administrative framework comprising State Government departments, Urban Local Bodies (ULBs), and Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs). Each level of governance plays a critical role in public finance, service delivery, and infrastructure development. With increasing demands for transparency, efficiency, and financial accountability, the need for robust accounting and audit systems has become paramount. This article provides an in-depth examination of the current practices, reforms, and challenges in the accounting and audit systems at these three levels of government in Maharashtra.

2. Constitutional and Administrative Framework

India follows a three-tier governance structure under the Constitution:

- **Union Government**
- **State Government**
- **Local Self-Governments**, comprising ULBs and PRIs

The 73rd and 74th Constitutional Amendments institutionalized PRIs and ULBs respectively, empowering them to function as independent entities with responsibilities in local governance, planning, and implementation of development programs. Maharashtra, being an early adopter of decentralized governance,

has extensive networks of municipal corporations, councils, nagar panchayats, zilla parishads, panchayat samitis, and gram panchayats.

3. State Government Accounting and Audit System

3.1 Accounting Framework

The State Government of Maharashtra follows the **cash basis of accounting**, in line with the **Indian Government Financial Reporting Standards (IGFRS)** issued by the **Government Accounting Standards Advisory Board (GASAB)**. Transactions are recorded only when cash is received or paid, which, although simpler, does not provide a holistic view of liabilities or accruals.

However, recognizing the limitations of cash-based accounting, GASAB and the Ministry of Finance have proposed a roadmap to transition towards **accrual accounting** for better financial reporting and decision-making.

3.2 Audit Mechanism

Audits of state departments are conducted by the **Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India** as per Article 149 of the Constitution. These audits cover:

- Compliance audits
- Performance audits
- Financial audits

Reports of the CAG are tabled in the State Legislature and reviewed by the Public Accounts Committee (PAC).

3.3 Reforms and Challenges

Key reforms include the implementation of **Treasury Net (TNet)**, **Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS)**, and plans for **migration to accrual accounting**. Challenges include:

- Legacy infrastructure
 - Resistance to change
 - Inadequate capacity among staff

4. Accounting System in Urban Local Bodies (ULBs)

4.1 Background

ULBs in Maharashtra include Municipal Corporations, Municipal Councils, and Nagar Panchayats. Traditionally, they operated on a **cash-based single-entry system**, which limited transparency and hindered accurate financial reporting.

4.2 Accrual-Based Double Entry Accounting

With reforms led by the **Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA)** and supported by institutions like **ICAI**, most ULBs have adopted the **accrual-based double-entry accounting system** as per the **National Municipal Accounts Manual (NMAM)**. The system requires:

- Income & Expenditure Statement
- Balance Sheet
- Receipts & Payments Account
- Cash Flow Statement

4.3 Role of ICAI

The **Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI)** has played a pivotal role by issuing **Accounting Standards for Local Bodies (ASLBs)**, aligned with **International Public Sector Accounting Standards (IPSAS)**. A dedicated **Committee on Public and Government Financial Management (CP&GFM)** supports adoption and training.

4.4 Audit Practices

ULBs are subject to both **internal and statutory audits**, and are required to submit annual accounts to the **Directorate of Municipal Administration (DMA)**. Some audits are further scrutinized by the **Local Fund Audit (LFA)**.

4.5 Reforms and Initiatives

Several national missions have catalyzed reforms in ULB accounting:

- **JNNURM**: Required accrual accounting as a pre-condition for grants
- **AMRUT**: Continued emphasis on capacity building and transparency
- **Public Disclosure Law (PDL)**: Mandated public availability of financial statements
- **Right to Information Act (RTI), 2005**: Boosted transparency in municipal governance

4.6 Challenges

Despite significant reforms, challenges remain:

- Non-qualified and inadequately trained accounting staff
 - Poor IT infrastructure (e.g., electricity, internet)
 - Irregular updates to asset registers
 - Limited internal control and MIS frameworks
 - Inconsistent statutory audit cycles

5. Accounting in Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs)

5.1 Overview

PRIs include Zilla Parishads, Panchayat Samitis, and Gram Panchayats. They are crucial for rural development and execution of state and central schemes. However, their accounting systems have traditionally remained **manual and cash-based**.

5.2 e-Panchayat Initiative

Under the Ministry of Panchayati Raj, the **e-Panchayat Mission Mode Project** has been launched to digitize PRI operations. Software modules like **PRIASoft** are being used to introduce double-entry accounting and standardized reporting formats.

5.3 Audit Practices

Audits are conducted by:

- **State Audit Department**
- **Local Fund Auditors**
- In some cases, **CAG** on request or for centrally sponsored schemes

Audit reports are submitted to the State Legislature and Panchayat bodies.

5.4 Key Challenges

- Lack of trained staff in remote areas
- Low IT penetration
- Weak internal controls
- Poor documentation and asset registers
- Limited understanding of accounting standards

7. Role of Chartered Accountants and ICAI

Chartered Accountants (CAs) are crucial in ensuring successful implementation of accounting reforms. Their roles include:

- Assisting in transition to accrual systems
- Training local government staff
- Conducting audits and preparing financial statements
- Advising on internal control and MIS systems

ICAI has also been instrumental through:

- Publication of technical guides
- Development of ASLBs
- Formation of committees such as CASLB and CP&GFM
- Conducting national training programs

8. Recommendations for Improvement

- **Capacity Building:** Mandatory certification programs for local accountants
- **Digital Infrastructure:** Investment in IT systems, electricity, and internet
- **Institutional Strengthening:** Formation of dedicated municipal accounting cadres
- **Internal Controls:** Establish comprehensive MIS and audit trails
- **Transparency:** Mandatory public disclosure of audited financials online

9. Conclusion

The journey towards efficient, transparent, and accountable financial governance in Maharashtra is underway. While ULBs have made significant strides through adoption of accrual accounting, PRIIs and State Departments still face implementation challenges. Sustained efforts in training, infrastructure development, and policy support are essential. Chartered Accountants and ICAI will continue to play a key enabling role in strengthening public financial management across all levels of governance in the state.
